

What is it?

Our car driver assessment scheme is based on an initial one-hour assessment in your own car. The assessment is based on common sense and safe, skilful, everyday driving. There are no trick questions or unusual manoeuvres - but it would be useful to look at a copy of the Highway Code beforehand.

Who is it for?

Anyone who feels an assessment of his or her skills and knowledge would be beneficial to their driving and confidence.

How does it work?

Following the one-hour assessment, you will be given a written report together with verbal feedback.

Your vehicle must be roadworthy and legal, and if you normally wear glasses for driving, you will be required to wear them. You will need to show the assessor your:

- Drivers Licence - (for those who now have the photo card type licence remember to also show the paper document that was sent by the DVLA with this type of licence)
- Certificate of insurance
- MOT Certificate.

Listed below are just a few of the areas covered:

- Moving off
- Correct use of signals
- Roundabouts
- Positioning
- Hill starts
- Overtaking
- Clutch control
- Road sense
- Passengers
- Traffic Lights
- Knowledge of Highway Code.
