

What is it?

Working in partnership with Gloucestershire Magistrates and the Department for Transport, Road Safety provides the opportunity for convicted drink drivers to benefit from a rehabilitation course.

Who is it for?

Convicted drink drivers who have been referred by the Courts.

How does it work?

Our course is not intended to punish convicted drivers further - they have already been disqualified and fined for their offence.

The purpose is to teach about the effects of alcohol consumption.

A range of issues are covered, including information about alcohol and its effect on the body; the effect of alcohol on performance, particularly driving ability, and behaviour.

When does it happen?

We provide both daytime and evening courses:

- Daytime - one day a week for four weeks between 9.30am and 3pm
- Evening - two evenings a week for four weeks between 6pm - 8.30pm.

How much does it cost?

The current course fee is £195 (subject to change on 1st April 2009).

Where do I attend?

The course venue(s) are:

- Gloucester - Gloucestershire County Council, Environment Directorate, Bearland, Block 5, Shire Hall, Longsmith Street (next door to Gloucester Police Station)
- Cirencester - Cotswold District Council, Trinity Road, Cirencester.
